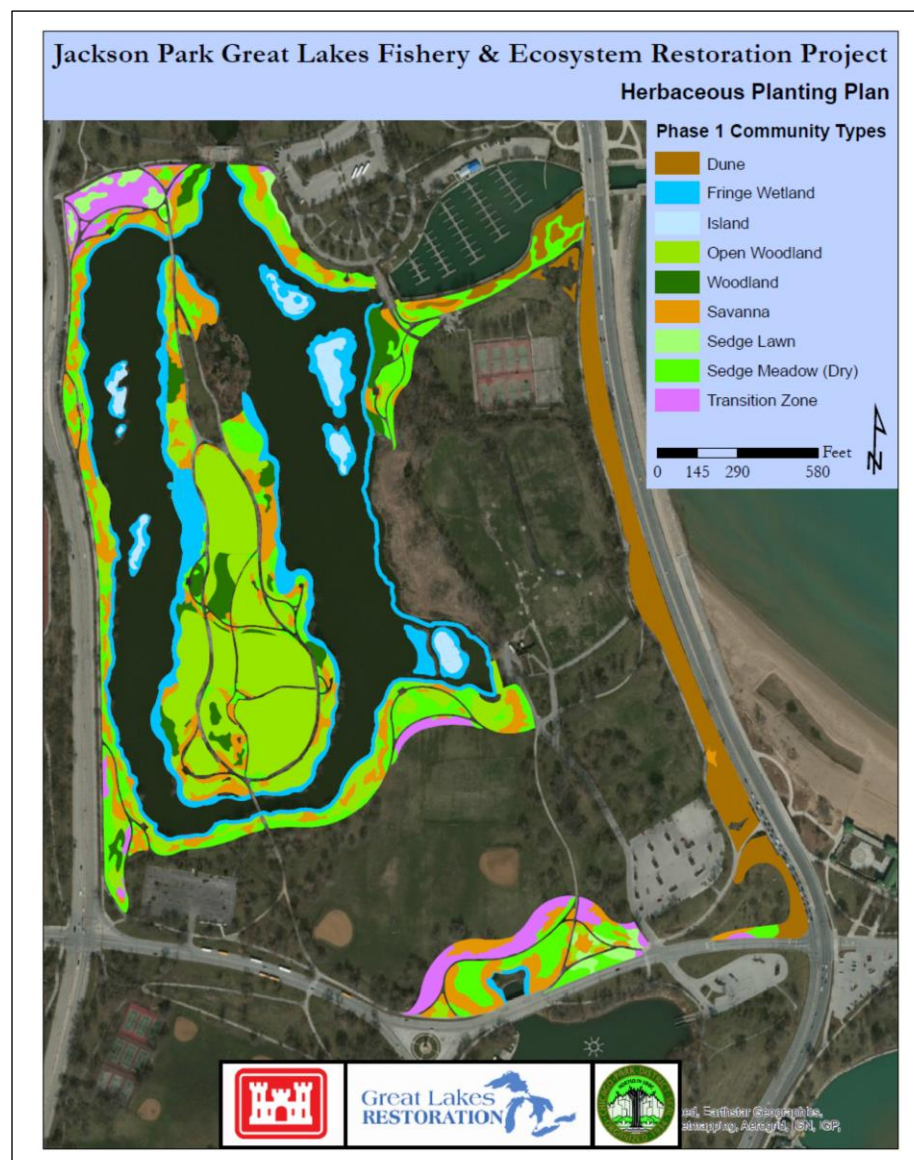


Habitat Restoration In Progress



The ongoing work at Jackson Park is part of a 5-year capital improvement project to restore wildlife habitat within the natural areas of Jackson Park. The Chicago Park District and U.S. Army Corps of Engineers are partners in this bio-cultural endeavor that integrates ecosystem restoration and cultural landscapes.

The project includes the following:

- Removal and management of invasive plants and fish
- Reintroduction of native fish, mussels and amphibians
- Installation of over 400,000 native trees, shrubs and herbaceous plants
- Introduction of over 300 different species of plants
- Grading and stabilization of lagoon shorelines
- Formation of shoreline wetlands, meadows, oak savannas, woodlands, dunes, and sedge lawn communities
- Improvement of existing pathways on Wooded Island
- Installation of new pathways
- Installation of 9 overlooks
- Incorporation of Frederick Law Olmsted's historic design principles
